
ResearcherID

ResearcherID is a global, multi-disciplinary scholarly research community where members can register for unique identifier, build a profile of their scholarly works, view citation metrics, and search for like-minded researchers.

Scopus to ORCID



The tool enables users to search the [DataCite Metadata Store](#) for their works, and subsequently to add (or claim) those research outputs – including datasets, software, and other types – to their ORCID profile. This should increase the visibility of these research outputs, and will make it easier to use these data citations in applications that connect to the ORCID Registry – [ImpactStory](#) is one of several services already doing this.

The new service also provides formatted citations in several popular citation styles, supports COinS, links to related resources, and displays the attached

[Creative Commons license](#) where this information is available. In addition to datasets, the DataCite Metadata Store of course also contains many text documents from academic publishers and services such as [figshare](#) or [PeerJ](#)











An **industry-wide methodology** for connecting scholarly publications to research funders

HOW FUNDREF WORKS


1. FundRef Registry provides a taxonomy of 4000 standardized funder names.
2. Manuscript tracking system vendors incorporate FundRef Registry into the publication submission processes. Publishers ask authors to select correct funders and provide grant numbers upon manuscript submission.
3. Funder information transferred to publisher production systems.
4. Publishers send funder information to CrossRef
5. Funders and others query CrossRef and receive DOIs and metadata for articles resulting from their funding.
6. Publishers may display FundRef data in CrossMark Record tab.
