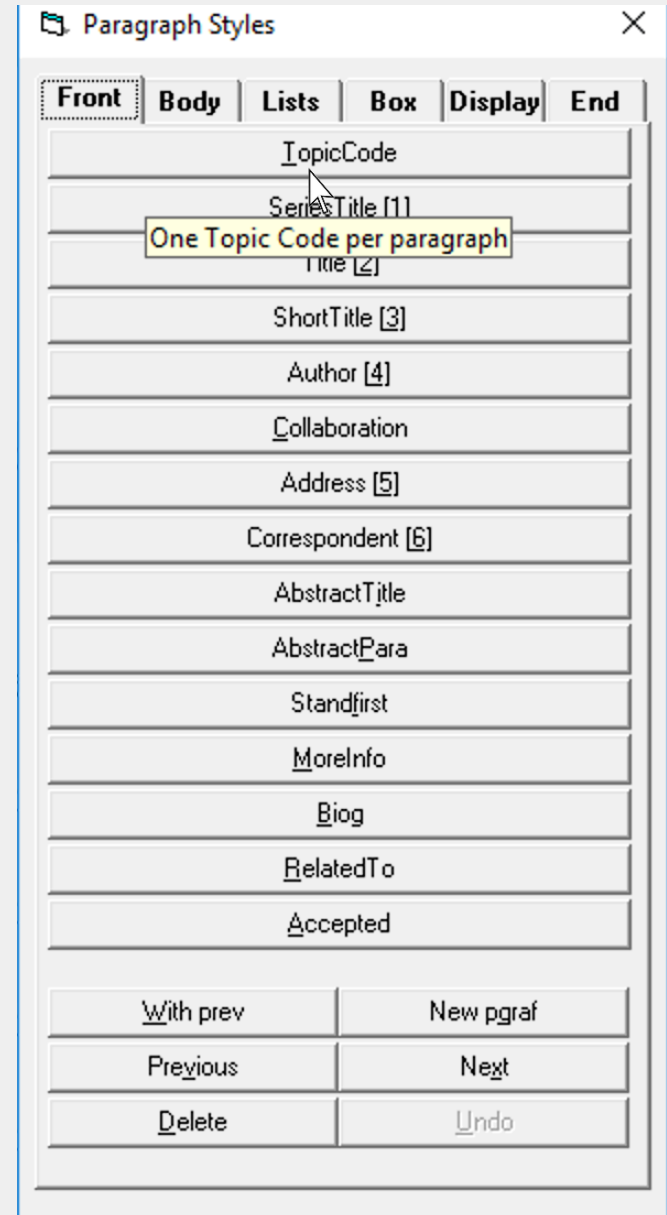

# eXtyles User Interface

- ▶ Slight reorganization to accommodate Enhanced Auto-Redact
  - ▷ Edit group
  - ▷ Compare/Tags group
- ▶ Tool tips!
  - ▷ eXtyles ribbon
  - ▷ Cleanup, Post-Processing Cleanup, and Compare to Baseline dialogs
  - ▷ Paragraph Styling palette

# Future Possibilities

Not yet developed, but... would this sort of thing (i.e., custom tool tips for individual paragraph styles) be useful to you?



# Reapply Styles

- ▶ Can be added as a checkbox in the Document Information dialog
- ▶ Useful for customers who work with author-templated content, especially when templates have gone through multiple updates (or when authors make local changes to style appearance)
- ▶ During Activation or Update Document Information, ensures the visual formatting of any eXtyles paragraph style applied by the author conforms with current template settings

# Cleanup

New feature: highlight hidden text

- ▶ Marks all hidden text with Word comments
- ▶ Option to make all hidden text visible
- ▶ Word comment includes a fragment of the text to provide additional context

# Enhanced Auto-Redact

- ▶ Enables staging of Auto-Redact, so different rules can be applied at different times during editing
- ▶ Takes advantage of Advanced Processing to allow for targeted editing of color-coded document elements
- ▶ Allows for multiple lists of rules (e.g., user can choose between American and British spelling)

# Sample Use Cases

- ▶ Convert all common variants of the publisher “John Wiley & Sons” to “Wiley” in book references
- ▶ Replace commas between author–date in-text reference citations with semicolons
- ▶ Highlight any paragraphs styled as “Normal”
- ▶ Flag illegal manually applied character styles in references (e.g., au\_surname instead of bib\_surname)
- ▶ Flag the running head when it is over 55 characters
- ▶ Re-run a subset of Auto-Redact rules to remove common copyediting artifacts before XML export

# Post-Processing Cleanup

- ▶ Run on selected text
- ▶ Re-run previous settings
  - ▷ Hold down the Shift key when pressing the Post-Processing Cleanup button
  - ▷ Re-runs Post-Processing Cleanup with previously selected settings
  - ▷ Enables the user, for example, to repeatedly select <unknown> references and remove the eXtyles tags without re-opening the dialog



# Update Stale Metadata

- ▶ Because stale bread is good for gazpacho, but stale metadata is good for nothing!
- ▶ Provides an alert before XML export if it has been more than N days (configurable on a per-export basis) since metadata was last updated with Update Document Information

# ORCID Integration Enhancements

- ▶ Loads author email addresses included in the transmittal file and passes them through to exported JATS XML
- ▶ Loads author xref elements included in the transmittal file that connect individual authors with individual funding grants and passes them through to exported JATS XML
- ▶ Supports Scholar One DTD XML transmittal files

# ORCID Integration Enhancements

- ▶ Allows order of authors in the transmittal file to be different from the order of authors in the Word file, as long as each author can be uniquely identified
- ▶ Supports two authors with the same surname when the first name or initial of each of the authors is unique
- ▶ Allows identical author names if the transmittal and Word author list orders match
